




OFFICIAL CITY STREET & TRAIL MAP


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TRAIL DESCRIPTIONS

TRAIL MAP - WALK, HIKE, RIDE, DRIVE

-  **ATV**
-  **HIKING**
-  **JEEP (4WD)**

1. TRANSFER TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 602)
24 miles/38.6 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5544764535, long: -107.331117391

Take Traver Trail Road .5 mile to Transfer Trail. Go 1.5 miles to the trailhead, the main access to the Flat Tops. This is a 4WD road and connects to the Coffee Pot Road near Deep Lake.

2. STORM KING MEMORIAL TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1844)
1 mile/2.4 km to Observation Point
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5761977669, long: -107.440127

Take I-70 West to Exit 109 (Canyon Creek exit), then right and take the frontage road east to the trailhead. Steep grade. Hiking only. No bicycles, horses or motorized vehicles. Constructed in memory of the 1994 Storm King firefighters who died here.

3. KEYSER CREEK TRAIL
Moderate (FS 1844)
7 miles/11.3 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.610972, long: -107.434639

Narrow, rough hiking trail at the end of the East Canyon Creek Road, connects to Transfer Trail near Blue Lake. Trailhead surrounded by private land with limited parking. Hiking only.

4. WULFSOHN MOUNTAIN PARK TRAILS
Moderate
lat: 39.552833, long: -107.349944

Located behind the Glenwood Springs Community Center and Glenwood Meadows shopping center. The Wulfsohn system includes shorter loops of approximately one mile, and the option to connect several trails for a loop just over 4 miles in length. The trail system extends west across Wulfsohn Mountain Park.

5. EAST ELK CREEK/CENTENNIAL TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1841)
4 miles/5.6 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5923986114, long: -107.55666849

From New Castle, take Co. Rd. 226 NW. Turn right on Co. Rd. 241 to trailhead. Trail travels along East Elk Creek through a canyon including waterfalls. Highlights include remains of early gold mining days.

6. HADLEY GULCH TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1840)
7 miles/11.3 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.6044396045, long: -107.585942958

From New Castle, take Co. Rd. 226 NW. Turn right on Co. Rd. 243 N to Clinetop Road. Trailhead parking on the left. Stay on trail through private property. Signs of wildlife. Hiking only.

7. GLENWOOD CANYON PATH
Easy
16 miles/26 km
Concrete
lat: 39.5507543604, long: -107.320001281

Take the popular bike path along the Colorado River to the east trailhead west of Dotsero. There are rest areas at I-70 exits No Name, Grizzly Creek, Hanging Lake and Bair Ranch.

8. JESS WEAVER TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1847)
8 miles/13 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5670458521, long: -107.293811284

From the I-70 No Name exit, go north to the trailhead. The rocky trail climbs through a deep canyon to Transfer Trail. Hiking only.

9. RED MOUNTAIN & JEANNE GOLAY TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1847)
2 miles/3.2 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5457161595, long: -107.334288601

Take 7th Street west, left on Midland and right on 9th Street; the street dead ends at the trailhead. The route traverses up Red Mountain to an overlook.

10. BOY SCOUT TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1847)
3 miles/5 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5465876246, long: -107.318657026

Trailhead at the east end of 8th Street. Provides access to Lookout Mountain at the trail network. Very steep and rocky. Access also from Lookout Mountain Road.

11. DOC HOLLIDAY'S TRAIL
Easy
.5 mile/.8 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5412586579, long: -107.320879695

Trailhead at the intersection of 12th Street and Bennett Avenue; follow information signs. Trail climbs to Linwood Cemetery and the memorial of Doc Holliday. Hiking only.

12. WESTBANK TO CARBONDALE
Easy (Co. Rd. 154/109/108)
7.5 miles/12.1 km
Paved
lat: 39.4861864795, long: -107.295720164

Take Highway 82 S to Co. Rd. 154. At the traffic light, turn right and travel about .6 mile to Co. Rd. 109. Cross the Roaring Fork River. Continue to Co. Rd. 108 at the "T" turn left toward Carbondale.

13. STORM KING MOUNTAIN ROAD
Moderate/Difficult (FS 635)
5.5 miles/9 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.6008628996, long: -107.446560659


Take the single lane dirt road from Transfer Trail to the top of Storm King Mountain. Road is very narrow with lots of brush. No public outlet at south tip of trail. Trail dead ends at private property.

14. DEEP LAKE LOOP/TRANSFER TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 600 & 602)
24 miles/37 km (from Deep Lake to GWS)
Gravel/Natural Surface
lat: 39.7734362566, long: -107.304591567

Shuttle vehicles to Deep Lake via Coffee Pot Road (FS 600), ride bikes or 4WD to Glenwood Springs on Transfer Trail (FS 602). Cars access Deep Lake. Transfer for 4WD and bikers.

15. GRIZZLY CREEK TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 2065)
3 miles/5 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.56125, long: -107.250005556

From the I-70 Grizzly Creek Rest Area, the trail climbs through a scenic canyon with varying rock formations. Trail becomes very rough in upper sections. Hiking only.

Road
Easy, Beginner Route: Gentle grades (generally under 5%) with little or gradual elevation gain. Open sight distance with few blind curves. Relatively smooth grade with few or no surface obstructions. Ample side clearance with surface or no clearance obstructions.

Road
Moderate, Intermediate Route: Moderate grades (ranging from 6% to 10%) with extended climbs and some elevation change. Some limited sight distance. Some uneven and rough surface obstacles. Some narrow stretches, with some clearance obstructions. 4WD recommended with high clearance.

Trail
Difficult, Expert Route: Steep grade with stretches over 12%, long climbs with significant elevation change. Restricted sight distance with many blind curves. Rough surface with many obstructions. Narrow side clearance with frequent obstructions. 4WD with high clearance recommended.

Darker green indicates Forest Service land.
Tan/Light Brown indicates BLM land.
P Parking Area
Light green areas indicate non-federal land. Mostly private property not open to public use or access unless otherwise indicated.



16. HANGING LAKE TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1847)
1.2 miles/2 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5891977796, long: -107.190619006

Limited access hiking trail climbs to Hanging Lake, which was created by a geological fault. Spouting Rock is just 5-minutes beyond the lake. **No dogs, swimming or fishing.**

17. DEADHORSE TRAIL
Difficult (FS 1851)
6.5 miles/10.5 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5927939118, long: -107.184500235

Climbs out of Glenwood Canyon from the Hanging Lake Trail. Connects with Forest Service Road 622 north to Coffee Pot Springs. Trail steep and rocky in places. Hiking only.

18. BURNT TREE RIDGE TRAIL
Moderate
3.5 miles/5.6 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.627, long: -107.105611

Old 4WD single lane road. Access from the East Glenwood Canyon Path trailhead at the end of the I-70 frontage road, west of Dotsero.

19. DOTSERO-UTE TRAIL
Moderate
4 miles/6.4 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.6528067887, long: -107.063987664

Access from the Colorado River Road at the trailhead north of Dotsero. Connects with Coffee Pot Road but is very rough around the private property. Historic trade route used by the Utes.

20. LOOKOUT MOUNTAIN ROAD
Moderate (Co. Rd. 120)
5.5 miles/9 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5371964248, long: -107.279834906

Co. Rd. 120 climbs from Spring Valley to the top of Lookout Mountain. Outstanding overlook and old campground at the end. Access to Little Grand Mesa Road.

21. CATTLE CREEK LOOP
Moderate
5 miles/8 km
Paved/Gravel
lat: 39.4578801156, long: -107.262620038

Route begins at Cattle Creek Road (Co. Rd. 113) off of Highway 82. At Co. Rd. 112, the climb is quick and steep. Descends on Crystal Springs Road (Co. Rd. 103), returning back to Highway 82.

22. SPRING VALLEY LOOP
Easy
6.5 miles/10.4 km
Gravel
lat: 39.470960363, long: -107.240368964

From the Red Canyon Road take Road 119 to Road 114, past Colorado Mountain College to Highway 82. Great views of Mount Sopris and the Elk Range.

23. LITTLE GRAND MESA ROAD
Moderate (FS 535)
10 miles/16 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5153534011, long: -107.264454502

Rough 4WD single lane, steep stretches, very muddy when wet. Accesses the south rim of Glenwood Canyon from Lookout Mountain Rd.; connects to Forest Hollow Trail and Boy Scout Trail.

24. FORREST HOLLOW TRAIL
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1847)
5 miles/8 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5425541862, long: -107.297144929

Narrow trail connects the Boy Scout Trail to the Little Grand Mesa Road on the north slope of Lookout Mountain. Difficult mountain bike route.

25. HUBBARD'S TRAIL
Moderate
.5 miles/.8 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5385391037, long: -107.263838341

Take Little Grand Mesa Road to the trailhead in Deadman's Creek. It is a short hike to the overlook of the Glenwood Canyon.

26. COFFEE POT ROAD
Easy (FS 600)
28 miles/45 km (to Deep Lake)
Gravel
lat: 39.6686274036, long: -107.068264889

Exit from I-70 and go 1.5 miles north on the Colorado River Road. This is the main access to the Flat Tops Wilderness Area and connects to Transfer Trail near Deep Lake. Snowmobile route in winter.

27. DEEP CREEK TRAIL
Moderate
3 miles/5 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.6787070339, long: -107.097446436

Narrow single track trail, rough in places. Trailhead along Coffee Pot Road. Dead ends in Deep Creek Canyon. Hiking only.

28. WAGON GULCH ROAD
Moderate (FS 622/623)
6 miles/9.6 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.6710216269, long: -107.231918596

Rough 4WD single lane roads. Dead ends along the north rim of Glenwood Canyon. Access via Coffee Pot Road.

29. FISHER CREEK TRAIL
Easy/Moderate
3.7 miles/6 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.4606664165, long: -107.199695594

Take Hwy 82 south to Co. Rd. 114, which goes to Colorado Mountain College Spring Valley Campus. Go right on Co. Rd. 115 and follow it 4.5 miles to trailhead. From where the trail starts on Co. Rd. 115 it merges with Cattle Creek, where there are ponds and historic structures.

30. RED CANYON ROAD
Easy/Moderate (Co. Rd. 115)
12 miles/19.3 km
Gravel
lat: 39.5038433696, long: -107.301430212

Take Hwy 82 south 4 miles to Red Canyon Road. Connects to Gypsum via Cottonwood Pass, Lookout Mountain Road, Spring Valley Loop and Cattle Creek Loop.

31. MITCHELL CREEK TRAIL (COVER PHOTO)
Moderate/Difficult (FS 1847)
5 miles/8 km
Natural Surface
lat: 39.5730025035, long: -107.371082743

Extends from the end of Mitchell Creek (Co. Rd. 132) to Transfer Trail. Park at the Glenwood Springs Fish Hatchery. Hiking only.

32. ATKINSON CANAL TRAIL
Easy
3.1 miles out and back/5 km
Paved
lat: 39.5471005, long: -107.3327682

Paved trail located along the Roaring Fork River in Glenwood Springs.

BIKE AROUND TOWN
Parking is available at Two Rivers Park. A pedestrian/bike bridge located in Two Rivers Park crosses the Colorado River to 7th Street for access to downtown. To get through town it is recommended to use Pitkin Avenue or Blake rather than Grand Avenue. For your safety, cross the Colorado River using the pedestrian/bike bridge.

The center combines a knowledgeable staff with technology, video, graphics and displays to provide information about the college and community.</p>	 <p>HOT SPRINGS POOL The World's Largest Outdoor Therapy Pool. Enjoy a fun-filled 90 degree soak in the main pool or 104 degrees in the therapy pool.</p>
 <p>DOC HOLLIDAY'S GRAVE The infamous gambler/gunfighter is buried in Linwood Cemetery — a short hike from 12th and Bennett Street.</p>	 <p>STORM KING MEMORIAL Memorial to the 14 firefighters who died in the Storm King Mountain fire in July, 1994. Located in Two Rivers Park.</p>
 <p>FRONTIER HISTORICAL MUSEUM Operated by the Frontier Historical Society, the museum features collections of artifacts, photographs, archives and Doc Holliday memorabilia.</p>	 <p>SUNLIGHT MOUNTAIN RESORT Skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing and Nordic skiing all winter. Summer features horseback rides.</p>
 <p>GLENWOOD CANYON World-famous monument to engineering ingenuity. See it from I-70 or from the 16-mile long concrete hiking/biking trail.</p>	 <p>YAMPA SPA & VAPOR CAVES First discovered by the Ute Indians, these underground caves form natural geothermal steam baths.</p>
 <p>GLENWOOD CAVERNS ADVENTURE PARK For a great family experience, enjoy spectacular views while riding the Iron Mountain Tramway. Take a tour of the Glenwood Caverns where you will see amazing formations. Enjoy top-to-bottom fun on the exciting thrill rides.</p>	 <p>WHITewater ACTIVITY AREA The whitewater activity area is located on the Colorado River just upstream from the Midland Avenue bridge and I-70's Exit 114 in West Glenwood Springs.</p>
 <p>HANGING LAKE One of Colorado's most popular hikes and most photographed sites. The trailhead is in Glenwood Canyon.</p>	 <p>GLENWOOD VAUDEVILLE REVUE A two-hour family fun show with professional talent performing a variety of hilarious skits, jokes, high energy dance numbers, unique novelty songs and original routines that are guaranteed to make you laugh your worries away.</p>
 <p>HISTORIC DOWNTOWN In the 1890s the area had up to 23 saloons and numerous bordellos. Today the 1904 Denver and Rio Grande train station is served by AMTRAK and there are many attractive shops and fine restaurants.</p>	 <p>IRON MOUNTAIN HOT SPRINGS The new Iron Mountain Hot Springs alongside the Colorado River features a family pool with an elevated section where parents can relax while watching kids play. Also 16 smaller mineral hot springs pools for soaking.</p>
 <p>HOTEL COLORADO A charming Victorian hotel built in 1893. Surround yourself with a century of legendary memories, plus a restaurant, lounge, spa and gift shop.</p>	 <p>GLENWOOD HOT SPRINGS LOT A Shuttle Service Glenwood Hot Springs provides door-to-door service from Lot A to the Glenwood Hot Springs Pool Guest Entrance. The Hot Springs Hopper runs continuously during pool hours.</p>
